Rules and Regulations

All persons competing or attending any the showcase series or Eastern Miniatures show are subject to the following rules which must be obeyed at all times by all persons attending the show

1. Once an entry has been made, no fees will be refunded without a vet/doctors certificate.

2. The judge's decision is final. Any objections must be made in writing to the show secretary within 30mins of the incident and be accompanied by a deposit of ± 10.00 refundable only if the objection is upheld.

3. AT ALL TIMES when mounted, riders MUST wear correctly fastened protective headgear to BS EN 1384, PAS015 or ASTM F1163 standards.

4. The organizers reserve the right to refuse entry to any class or the show-ground

5. All dogs must be kept on leads.

6. Children's age is to be taken on the date of the show.

7. No person shall allow a stallion for which he/she is responsible, to compete or be prepared to compete, in any competitions without taking adequate precautions to ensure that other members of the public are not put at risk of injury.

8. Stallions and Colts may be led by a child as long as the child is competent, if the judge considers the child not in control they may ask for the exhibit leave the ring

9. Please do not muck out your lorry/trailer onto the fields.

10. Please take your litter home with you or use the bins provided.

11. Smoking is only permitted in designated areas, and prohibited around the stables.

12. All bookings of the centre, once confirmed, are liable to a 50% cancellation fee should they be moved or cancelled.

13. The showcase Series an reserve the right to cancel, add or amend any of the competitions as they see fit, due to weather conditions etc.

14. Children must be under adult supervision at all times.

15. All horses/ponies must only move through areas shared with pedestrians at walk.

16. No Venue, nor any of its representative or staff shall be held liable for any accident, injury, damage or loss what-so-ever.

17. Any animal showing signs of disease or illness will be asked to leave the show ground immediately

18. Please conduct yourself in a courteous manner, any abuse to person or animal will not be tolerated and will be asked to leave the showground.

19. ANY person whether spectator or competitor, that has been banned from any other affiliated show within the last 2 years will

20. Competitors are advised to have public liability insurance

21. Any complaints must be taken up with the secretaries with a deposit of £40 within 20 minutes of the incident.

22. This show will be run with a social media code of conduct. Any cyber bullying, coercion of judges or show team members will not be tolerated in any way. Slanderous or libel comments put on social media will be taking seriously and action taken.

23. NO lunging in collecting rings.

This doesn't mean they have to be a winner of a class, this award is for some one that shows a talent, a good sport, and that tries really hard. Golden tickets can be accepted by any competition this season. If you are handed a golden ticket then you become eligible for the Talent Spotters Supreme Championship that will take place at our Showcase of the Year Show in October (08/10/2023)

EASA Qualifier- The East Anglian Showing Awards is new for 2024. We have joined forces with other clubs in East Anglia to unite our clubs on things like rules and class specification, but most importantly we are encouraging local showing. The ability to gain points across the participating clubs in over 20 commonly offered classes. This will result in a black tie awards

evening in November 2024, with wonderful prizes and awards. Ring 1- Youngstock, Novice and Colour Classes

To be Judged by-

To start at 09.45

Class 1A- Open Foal- open to foals born in 2023, can be shown with the mare but the mare will not be judged

Class 1- Open yearling- open to any horse or pony, in its yearling year as of the 1st jan 23

Class 2- Open 2 year old- open to any Horse or Pony, in its 2year old year as of the 1st jan 23

Class 3- Open 3 year old- Open to any Horse or Pony, in its 3year old year as of the 1st jan 23

Class 4- Open Novice Horse or Pony- open to any horse or pony, must not have won more than twice this season

Class 5- Novice Handler- open to any handler that has not won more than twice this season. **To be judged 80% on way of handling and 20% on horses presentation and way of going**

Class 6- Young Handler- open to any child under 14 years of age, special award to highest place 7 & under, 7-10 and 10-14 year old. **To be judged 80% on way of handling and 20% on horses presentation and way of going**

Class 7- Senior Handler- open to any handler over 16 years old, special award to highest placed 50+. **To be** *judged 80% on way of handling and 20% on horses presentation and way of going*

Class 8- Open Coloured- open to any horse or pony with a broken coloured coat, can be of any type or breed, may be shown plaited, hogged, trimmed or naturally. **This class will be judged 50% on colour and** *markings, 25% on way of going and 25% on conformation*

Class 9- Open solid Colour- open to any horse or pony with a solid coloured coat Bay, chestnut, black, grey, can be of any type or breed, may be shown plaited, hogged, trimmed or naturally. **This class will be** *judged 50% on colour and markings, 25% on way of going and 25% on conformation*

Class 10- Open Odd Colour- open to any horse or pony with a palomino, buckskin, roan, dun, spotted etc coloured coat, can be of any type or breed, may be shown plaited, hogged, trimmed or naturally. **This class will be judged 50% on colour and markings, 25% on way of going and 25% on conformation**

Ring 2- Mountain & Moorland & Pony Classes

To be Judged by-

To start at 9.15am

Class 11- Shetland- ponies should be registered within their relevant societies.

Class 12- Small Breed Mountain & Moorland- ponies should be registered within their relevant societies. Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh A & B Class 13- Large breed Mountain & Moorland- ponies should be registered within their relevant societies. Connemara, New Forest, Dales, Fell & Highland, Welsh C & D Class 14- Show Ponies, Riding Ponies, Show Hunter Ponies – open to any pony under 148cm. Ponies to be shown plaited Class 15- Part bred pony- Open to any pony under 158cm. Ponies to be shown plaited Class 16- Veteran Horse or Pony- open to any horse or pony 15 year or over. Can be of any type or breed. Lead reins Permitted. 1st place will automatically qualify for the supreme Class 17- Miniature Horse Youngstock Class 18- Miniature Horse Senior Mare

Class 19- Miniature Horse Senior Stallion or Gelding

Ring 3- Traditional Cobs & Horse Classes

To be Judged by-

To start at 09.15am

Class 20- Traditional & Native Type- To be shown in natural coat

Class 21- Coblet- not to exceed 138cm, to be shown in natural coat

Class 22- Hack/Riding Horse/Hunter- Horses to be presented plaited and pulled and traditional attire must be worn

Class 23- Show cob and Maxi Cobs- Horses to be presented hogged, trimmed and traditional attire must be worn

Class 24- Irish Draughts and Part Breds- horses do not need to be registered but should be of Irish decent and draught type, to be shown plaited, trimmed or hogged and in traditional attire

Class 25- Warmbloods and Sports Horses- horses do not need to be registered but should be of

Warmbloods or sports horse origin, to be shown plaited, trimmed and in traditional attire

Class 26- Thoroughbreds- Horses do not have to have raced or be registered with weatherbys, to be shown plaited, trimmed and in traditional attire

Class 27- Foreign and Rare Breed- horses do not need to be registered as "pure" but should be of the breed standard. Any horse breed from outside of the UK native breeds may enter. Horses should be shown and presented as per their breed standard.

Class 28- Home Produced- horses and ponies to be owned and produced by their owners at home or diy livery yard. A highest placed award will be given to the highest placed Youngstock. Both the 1st and 2nd placed and the highest placed youngstock will earn their spot directly into the supreme Championship

On conclusion of all classes in Rings 1-3, we will move to our Matinee Presentation Performance of our Championships. There will be music and a chance to get pictures in our presentation display. This will all take place in the indoor arena around 12.00pm.

Ring 1- Novice, Junior and Colour Classes

To be Judged by-

To start at 1.30pm

Class 29- Ridden Novice Horse or Pony- open to any horse or pony that has not won more than twice this season. Canter will be asked to be displayed

Class 30- Novice Walk and Trot Only – Open to any type, this class is for very novice riders and children coming off the leadrein and for ponies/horses that have been broken during the 2023 season. Please use this class in the spirit its intended

Class 31- Ridden Novice Rider- open to any rider that has not won more that twice showing this season. You will be asked to have a short canter in this class

Class 32- Leadrein- open to any breed or type of pony, children not to have reached their 10th birthday as of the date of the show. Lead reins must be attached to the noseband

Class 33- First Ridden- open to any breed or type of pony, children not to have reached their 12th birthday as of the date of the show. Children may compete in both the leadrein and first ridden. Ponies 128cms & under Class 34- Junior Rider- open to any breed or type of pony, children not to have reached their 16th birthday as of the date of the show

Class 35- Ridden Open Coloured- open to any horse or pony with a broken coloured coat, can be of any type or breed, may be shown plaited, hogged, trimmed or naturally. This class will be judged 50% on colour and markings, 25% on way of going and 25% on conformation

Class 36- Ridden Open Solid Colour - open to any horse or pony with a solid coloured coat Bay, chestnut, black, grey, can be of any type or breed, may be shown plaited, hogged, trimmed or naturally. This class will be judged 50% on colour and markings, 25% on way of going and 25% on conformation

Class 37- Ridden Open Odd Colour- open to any horse or pony with a palomino, buckskin, roan, dun, spotted etc coloured coat, can be of any type or breed, may be shown plaited, hogged, trimmed or naturally. This class will be judged 50% on colour and markings, 25% on way of going and 25% on conformation

Ring 2- Mountain & Moorland & Pony Classes

To be Judged by-

To start at 2pm

Class 38- Ridden Small Breed Mountain & Moorland- ponies should be registered within their relevant societies. Shetland, Welsh A & B, Dartmoors and Exmoors. Lead Reins permitted Class 39- Ridden Large Breed Mountain & Moorland- ponies should be registered within their relevant societies. Welsh C & D, Connemara, New Forest, Dales, Fell & Highland. Class 40- Ridden Show Pony/Riding Pony/Show Hunter Pony/Part Bred- open to any pony under 153cm. Ponies to be shown plaited. Lead reins permitted. Class 41- Ridden Veteran Horse or Pony- open to any horse or pony 15 year or over. Can be of any type or breed. Lead reins Permitted. 1st and 2nd place will automatically qualify for the supreme. Class 42- Ridden Home Produced- horses and ponies to be owned and produced by their owners at

home or diy livery yard. Both the 1st and 2nd placed will earn their spot directly into the supreme Championship

Ring 3- Traditional Cobs and Horse Classes

To be Judged by-

To start at 2.00pm

Class 43- Ridden Traditional Cobs & Natives- To be shown in natural coat and traditional attire

Class 44- Ridden Coblet- no to exceed 138cm, to be shown in natural coat

Class 45- Ridden Hacks/Riding Horses/Hunter - Horses to be presented plaited and pulled and traditional attire must be worn, no ride judging in this class. Small and Large Hacks and Riding horses are permitted in this class.

Class 46- Ridden Show Cob & Maxi Cobs- Horses to be presented hogged and trimmed up and traditional attire must be worn, no ride judging in this class.

Class 47- Ridden Irish Draughts and Part Breds- horses do not need to be registered but should be of Irish decent and draught type, to be shown plaited, trimmed and in traditional attire, no ride judging in this class

Class 48- Ridden Warmbloods and Sports Horses- horses do not need to be registered but should be of Warmbloods or sports horse origin, to be shown plaited, trimmed and in traditional attire, no ride judging in this class Class 49- Ridden Thoroughbreds Horses do not have to have raced or be registered with weatherbys to be shown plaited, trimmed and in traditional attire, no ride judging in this class.

Class 50- Ridden Foreign & Rare Breed- horses do not need to be registered as "pure" but should be of the breed standard. Any horse breed from outside of the UK native breeds may enter. Horses should be shown and presented as per their breed standard. No ride judging in this class
