Rules and Regulations

All persons competing or attending any the showcase series or Eastern Miniatures show are subject to the following rules which must be obeyed at all times by all persons attending the show

- 1. Once an entry has been made, no fees will be refunded without a vet/doctors certificate.
- 2. The judge's decision is final. Any objections must be made in writing to the show secretary within 30mins of the incident and be accompanied by a deposit of £10.00 refundable only if the objection is upheld.
- 3. AT ALL TIMES when mounted, riders MUST wear correctly fastened protective headgear to BS EN 1384, PAS015 or ASTM F1163 standards.
- 4. The organizers reserve the right to refuse entry to any class or the show-ground
- 5. All dogs must be kept on leads.
- 6. Children's age is to be taken on the date of the show.
- 7. No person shall allow a stallion for which he/she is responsible, to compete or be prepared to compete, in any competitions without taking adequate precautions to ensure that other members of the public are not put at risk of injury.
- 8. Stallions and Colts may be led by a child as long as the child is competent, if the judge considers the child not in control they may ask for the exhibit leave the ring
- 9. Please do not muck out your lorry/trailer onto the fields.
- 10. Please take your litter home with you or use the bins provided.
- 11. Smoking is only permitted in designated areas, and prohibited around the stables.
- 12. All bookings of the centre, once confirmed, are liable to a 50% cancellation fee should they be moved or cancelled.
- 13. The showcase Series an reserve the right to cancel, add or amend any of the competitions as they see fit, due to weather conditions etc.
- 14. Children must be under adult supervision at all times.
- 15. All horses/ponies must only move through areas shared with pedestrians at walk.
- 16. No Venue, nor any of its representative or staff shall be held liable for any accident, injury, damage or loss what-so-ever.
- 17. Any animal showing signs of disease or illness will be asked to leave the show ground immediately
- 18. Please conduct yourself in a courteous manner, any abuse to person or animal will not be tolerated and will be asked to leave the show-ground.
- 19. ANY person whether spectator or competitor, that has been banned from any other affiliated show within the last 2 years will
- 20. Competitors are advised to have public liability insurance
- 21. Any complaints must be taken up with the secretaries with a deposit of £40 within 20 minutes of the incident.
- 22. This show will be run with a social media code of conduct. Any cyber bullying, coercion of judges or show team members will not be tolerated in any way. Slanderous or libel comments put on social media will be taking seriously and action taken.

Concours D'Elegance GB

First, second and third placed horses/ponies not already qualified in eligible classes will qualify for the Champion of Britain Title classes to be held at Onley Equestrian Centre, Rugby, Warwickshire on Sunday 3rd September 2023. If a horse/pony has already qualified, cards may be handed down to 6th place at judge's discretion. Each qualified horse/pony will receive a qualification card in the ring which will enable the owner to enter the Championship Show, provided the owner and rider/handler are, or become registered with the Concours d'Elegance Society within 21 days of the qualifying show. Class 1- Young Handler- This class is open to any child 16 and under, all children must wear riding hats, any type of horse or pony may be shown

Class 2- Adult Handler- This class is open to anyone 16 to 45, any Horse or Pony may be shown

Class 3- Senior Handler- This class is open to anyone 45 years and over, any Horse or Pony may be shown

Class 4- Youngstock- open to any breed/type. Yearling, 2 & 3year olds. Special rosette for highest placed Horse and highest placed Pony, each will then be eligible for the appropriate Championship

Class 5- Novice Horse/Pony- this class is open to any age or type. Horse not to have won more than 3 times this season. Special rosette for highest placed Horse and highest placed Pony, each will then be eligible for the appropriate Championship

- Class 6- Miniature Horse and Shetland ponies- Open to any Miniature Horse or Shetland
- Class 7- Mountain and Moorland- shetlands, exmoor, Dartmoor, welsh A and welsh B, fell, dales, highland, Connemara, new forest, welsh C and welsh D. Open to any age. This Class will be split if sufficient entries. Rosettes highest place small and large breed. Highest placed small or large breed to go forward for the pony championship if not placed 1st or second
- Class 8- Show Ponies, Hunter Ponies and Part Breds- open to any age. Ponies must be shown plaited, not to exceed 158cm
- Class 9- Traditional Cobs And Native Types- Open to any age, to be shown naturally.
- Class 10- Hacks and Riding Horse- open to any age, horses to be shown plaited.
- Class 11- Hunters and Show Cobs open to any age, horses to be shown plaited or hogged according to its type
- Class 12- Thoroughbreds- open to any age, horses do not have to have raced, to be shown plaited
- Class 13- Warmbloods and Sports Horses- open to any age, horses to be shown plaited
- Class 14- Irish Draught and Part Breds- open to any age, horses to be shown plaited or hogged
- Class 15- Foreign and Rare Breed- open to any age, horses to be shown as per their breed standard. Rare Breeds register ie Cleveland Bay, Suffolk Punch, Eskiray etc
- Class 16- Coloured Horse or Pony open to any age, to be shown plaited or hogged, or naturally
- Class 17- Solid Colour Horse or Pony- *Open to any horse or pony with a solid coat, may have markings.*Bays, Greys, Chestnut, Black.
- Class 18- Odd Colour Horse or Pony- open to any horse or Pony with a palomino, buckskin, Dun, cremello, roans or spotted coat, May have markings.
- Class 19- Veteran Horse or Pony- Horses/ponies to be shown plaited, hogged, trimmed or naturally.

 Must be 15 years of age or over. Special rosette for highest placed Horse and highest placed Pony, each will then be eligible for the appropriate Championship

Grand Champion Handler- 1st & 2nd places from classes 1 to 3

Grand Champion Inhand Pony- 1st & 2nd places from classes 6-9 and highest placed ponies from classes 4,5 & 19

Grand Champion Inhand Horse- 1st & 2nd places from classes 10- 15 and highest placed horses from classes 4, 5 & 19

Grand Champion Inhand Colour- 1st & 2nd places from classes 16-18

Supreme Inhand Grand Championship- All Champions and Reserve Champions to come forward for the Supreme of Show

Class 20- Inhand and Ridden Concours D'Elegance- a chance to break out the finery! Special Rosettes for Best Inhand and Best Ridden (class will be split if enough entries)

Class 21- Lead Rein Pony- Open to any pony not exceeding 128cm, leadreins should be attached to the noseband. Riders not to have exceeded the 9th Birthday. Ponies to be 4 years old and over

Class 22- First Ridden Pony- Open to any pony not exceeding 128cm. Riders not to have exceeded their 12th Birthday. Ponies to be 4 years old and over

Class 23- Junior Ridden Pony- *Open to any pony, not exceeding 148cm. Riders to have exceeded their 16th birthday. Ponies to be 4 years old and over*

Class 24- Novice Horse/Pony- this class is open to any age or type. Horse not to have won more than 3 times this season. Lead reins permitted. Open to horses 4 years old and over. Special rosette for highest placed Horse and highest placed Pony, each will then be eligible for the appropriate Championship

Class 25- Mountain and Moorland- Shetlands, Exmoor, Dartmoor, Welsh A,B,D,C, Fell, Dales, Highland, New Forest and Connemara. Lead reins permitted. Special rosettes to highest placed small and large breed. This class will be split if sufficient entries. Open to ponies 4 years old and over. Highest placed small or large breed to go forward for the pony championship if not placed 1st or second

Class 26- Show Ponies, Hunter Ponies and Part Breds- open to any age. Ponies must be shown plaited, not to exceed 158cm. Lead reins permitted

Class 27- Traditional Cob And Native Types- open to horses 4 years and over, to be shown naturally.

Class 28- Hacks and Riding Horses- open to horses 4 years and over, horses to be shown plaited.

Class 29- Hunters and Show Cobs- open to horses 4 years and over, horses to be shown plaited or hogged according to the horses type

Class 30- Thoroughbreds- open to horses 4 years old and over, horses do not have to have raced, to be shown plaited

Class 31- Warmbloods and Sports Horses- open to horses 4 years old and over, horses to be shown plaited

Class 32- Irish Draught and Part Breds- open to horses 4 years old and over, horses to be shown plaited or hogged

Class 33- Foreign and Rare Breed- open to any age, horses to be shown as per their breed standard. Rare Breeds register ie Cleveland Bay, Suffolk Punch, Eskiray etc

Class 34- Coloured Horse or Pony- open to horses 4 years old an over, to be shown plaited, hogged or naturally

Class 35- Solid Colour Horse or Pony- *Open to horses 4 years old, with a solid coat, may have markings.*Bays, Greys, Chestnut, Black, Buckskin, Palomino or Roan

Class 36- Veteran Horse or Pony- Horses/ponies to be shown plaited, hogged, trimmed or naturally.

Must be 15 years of age or over. Special rosette for highest placed Horse and highest placed Pony, each will then be eligible for the appropriate Championship

Grand Champion Junior Rider- 1st & 2nd placings from classes 21-23

Grand Champion Ridden Pony- 1st & 2nd placings from classes 25-27 and highest placed ponies from classes 24 & 36

Grand Champion Ridden Horse- 1st & 2nd placings from classes 28- 33 and highest placed ponies from classes 24 & 36

Grand Champion Ridden Colour- 1st & 2nd placings from classes 34-35
